OPENING OF MALLALA COMMUNITY COMPLEX

Mallala Community Complex was opened on the 19th November by Lions President Andrew Laird, Acting Mayor Marcus Strudwicke and Barry Flitter with about 80 guests from the local area, including local contractors and locals that have provided great support for the project

After the Pinery Fires it was determined there was no suitable building to be used for Emergency Command and Emergency Relief in the local area.

Mallala Lions with the support of Adelaide Plains Council, Barry and Rick Flitter from BTR Constructions and local

farmers etc, planned and built a fit for purpose building named the Mallala Community Complex which now is readily available in the event of any future disasters within the Adelaide Plains area, not only in the event of fires and would include any other natural disasters such as floods etc or even for major accidents etc.



The building is fully self sufficient, including a generator in the event of power blackouts and will serve as a comfortable respite area for First Responders.

Mallala Lions Club thanks all those involved in the construction and fit out of the building.

Neil gave the Address at the Dedication Service in 2003 he was then Speaker of the House of Representatives and Member for Wakefield.

The Coalition of Coastal Communities continues to be active in promoting the local area. With the support of the Adelaide Plains Council they are pursuing options for the restoration and placement of the dump protest statues in Dublin.

CCC Chairman John Drexel and member John Lush have been active in promoting the naming of the coast as "The Shorebird Coast" with articles in the Two Wells Echo and the Plains Producer. Alvin Jenkin also promoted it at the Council Public Forum in Two Wells late

last year together with a request to Council to improve promotion of tourism in the area. CCC will use this term actively in their communications, and signage. A working group is developing interpretative signage for placement in Dublin to promote the features of the area.

Every single one of us has a story. Some of these stories are grand and far-reaching; others are quiet and personal, held close. Some are handed down as lasting relics; others are broadcast widely or uploaded with fleeting regard for their permanence. We carry these stories with us; some of them are written across our faces. And every one of our stories is enmeshed with South Australia's vibrant, living history.

South Australia's History Festival | 1-31 May 2024 | Power

Balaklava Museum's is on Sunday, May 19th the event. Is called "A Day in the Life of a Blacksmith", and they have invited the Artist Blacksmiths Association and also the Yorke Peninsula Blacksmiths group to join them on that day.

In common with most volunteer organisations, PADAG has not been active over the Christmas New year period but is preparing for a busy 2024 with the first meeting on Tuesday February 13th. All local residents of Port Parham and Webb Beach are encouraged to attend together with other interested persons.

High on our agenda at this meeting will be preparations for the 150th anniversary .of Port Parham and Dublin in 2026.

The Parham Foreshore precinct development will also be high profile. Adelaide Plains Council have contracted a consultant to flesh out the plans prepared by the PADAG working group, and we anticipate an on site consultancy on this early in February 2024. Residents can expect communication on this in the next few weeks...

The Parham Camp ground has now been in 8 operation for months since the refurbishment, and it is proving to be attractive, and a considerable boost to community funds. PADAG volunteers clean and maintain the facilities, and feed back on Wiki Camps has been encouraging. The camp ground was submitted for the Australia Day Community Project award but sadly was not successful. Congratulations to the Dublin History Group for getting the Australia Day

community Event of the year for the Remembrance Day Ceremony for the 20th anniversary of the Dublin War Memorial

Horse float management continues to be an issue with floats parking at the boat ramp at Webb Beach impacting on the community and boating fraternities. Hopefully improved security at the Port Parham float parking area will encourage the horse fraternity to use the facilities established for their use.

PADAG has been well supported by representatives from the elected body of the Adelaide Plains Council, with John Lush until his resignation, and more latterly Terry-anne Keen. With the uncertainty within the Council due to the Electoral Commission stuff up, it is uncertain how this support will go in the future.

PADAG continues to lobby Council for the potential for green waste collection within the coastal communities, and have expressed concerns at the speeds that garbage pick up vehicles proceed in the built up areas. Speed limits are 40 kph in Port Parham and 35 kph in Webb Beach. Evidence is that the garbage vehicles travel well in excess of the limits and this has been confirmed with the vehicle owners who have GPS monitoring on the vehicles.

Community Car

The Mid North Community Passenger Network provides transport options for residents who are unable to access transport to medical, health and some personal appointments.

A community car based at Mallala is available for residents to attend medical or health appointments locally or in metropolitan areas. Accredited volunteer drivers collect passengers from their home and transport them to and from their appointment. Carers may travel free but must remain with the client at all times.

Eligible residents may be taken to medical, health and hospital appointments and some shopping and social activities (conditions apply).

This fee for service option provides flexibility and is available for appointment between 10am and 2pm Monday – Friday. Fees are based on distance travelled and include the return trip.

Veteran Affairs Gold cardholders may be entitled to service fee reimbursement. Outpatients of the Flinders Medical Centre, Royal Adelaide, Queen Elizabeth or Modbury Hospitals may also be eligible for reimbursement for all or part of travel costs.






